

We are looking for males (ages 21-65) of all orientations. Interested individuals must sign up (via email to triangle@lakeviewcitizens.org) by Feb 1st (space is limited) and will complete a brief profile for our "facebook." Bachelors receive two complimentary tickets to the event.

At the event, we will randomly match bachelors with dinner certificates. (Restaurant personnel will be paired with their own certificates.) The Lake View Citizens' Council and its twelve neighborhood associations continue to serve you the residents of this great community. Completing our 53rd year, we are pleased to represent over 100,000 people strong in five aldermanic wards.

Our twelve associations continue to be the grass roots association working with the community, local officials and government agencies to make our streets safer, cleaner and in better repair, to enhance our lake-front and other green spaces and, lastly, to protect our community from irresponsible development.

This ongoing effort is accomplished through the valiant efforts of volunteers who keep the community informed through public forums, news media, our website, community rallies, neighborhood meetings and many other assorted lines of communication. We are all working to make Lake View a better place to live, work and play.

We continue to work on Property Tax Reform. We continue to work with CTA on

station closings during the station expansion. We continue to work with the Cubs and Roof Top owners to ensure that their patrons come and leave our neighborhood respectfully. We continue to work with our five aldermen and alderwomen on issues regarding safety and zoning. We have had forums on Identity Theft, Graffiti, the Smoking Ban Ordinance and the Roof Top Ordinance. We work in helping those who are in need through Operation Mitten (providing winter coats, hats and mittens for those children in our area who are underprivileged) and the Thanksgiving Food Drive for the Lake View Pantry.

What's in store for next year?

Local Update: Roscoe Street Re-surfacing

Believe it or not, work still continues on the 800-900 blocks of West Roscoe Street. Triangle Neighbors has been working very closely with the 44th Ward Alderman's Office and CDOT to address concerns about the street.

Over the last couple months, Water Management has completed major sewer work on the north side of the street. The City has rebuilt some of the curbs and has taken a first pass at paving the street. Alderman Tunney reports that crews will come back and finish re-grading the street and making sure flooding concerns are minimized.

With respect to the speed humps, these will be installed approximately 60 days after street resurfacing is complete. As discussed at our Triangle Meetings, the plan is have one speed hump immediately west of the alley (815W) and a second one half way down the block (around the 900-mark). The humps will be made from recycled tires to reduce noise levels.
